On Sunday 29th APRIL 2012 at the 11.30am MASS ARCHBISHOP DIARMAID MARTIN wil join the priests and former priests of the Parish, parishioners and the many friends of the Parish to mark the 180th ANNIVERSARY of the laying of the Foundation Stone of the Church of St Andrew.

The new church was built at the then enormous cost of £20,000! It was built on a main street as part of a major building programme after the passing of Catholic Emancipation. The new

DID YOU KNOW THAT

- St Andrew's parishioners during the 18th
 Century heard Mass in a stable on Hawkins Street;
- the decision to build on Westland Row was supported by Daniel O'Connell who lived in Merrion Square and was the leading parishioner;
- Dr Michael Blake, the Parish Priest who laid the foundation stone for the church, had been the Rector of the Irish College in Rome and later became the Bishop of Dromore;
- the priests who served in Westland Row over the years included one who escaped the Redcoats in 1798, another who was tutor to Bonnie Prince Charlie in Rome, and a third who later became the first Bishop of Capetown in South Africa;
- the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament which is still active in Westland Row was founded in Rome on the Feast of St Andrew in 1539;
- St Andrew is the Patron Saint of fishermen, of Scotland and of Greece, and his relics are venerated in Amalfi in Italy.
