HERITAGE PROJECT

An important part of St Andrews Resource Centres work is the preservation and reclamation of the history and heritage of the Westland Row, City Quay area. The Resource Centre still retains the old roll books from its time as a Boys School. Many past pupils from the school have visited the centre and many of them have found their names among the ninety eight roll books that are available to people researching their family history. We are also working on a history publication at the moment to mark the centenary of the 1916 Rising. A small number of local people have sent us some stories about their grand parents experience of the Rising, but we still need more input from people who either live in the Westland Row, City Quay, Pearse Street areas to contact us if they remember a parent or grandparent who had stories to tell about the 1916 Rising.

Talk About Youth Project.

The Talk About Youth Project has just celebrated its 18th year working with young people from the Pearse Street Area. The project aims to provide a safe, non-threatening environment where young people can meet and socialise, build on their self esteem, develop their social skills and begin to take responsibility for shaping their own lives. For the last 18 years we have believed in young people and their ability, and that every young person has something to offer, in 2014 we still have this belief and strive for young people to reach their full potential in life.

The project works in a number of areas including Traditional Youth Clubs, Issue Based Programmes, Outreach, Music and Sports, Drug Awareness and Relationship, Sexuality and Education Programmes. We also provide an unstructured space for young people to hang out and just chill with their friends in "The Junction" which is open Monday to Friday from 7-10pm.

The project is quiet large with over 30 rogrammes and clubs being run on a weekly basis. Each group is based on the needs of the young people so as youth workers we are adaptive to the needs and wants of the young people.

The "Talk About Youth" Project, (Family Interaction Programme)

Our aim for this program was is to foster youth development through constructive measures. This Youth Initiative project was designed and delivered by 18 young people aged 14 to 17 with the support of their Youth Workers, over a period of 6 months.

The project reduced levels of social exclusion, by opening up communication channels between parents, guardians, and their children, and to give parents greater insight into the views of their children and vice versa.

Our hope was that this project would be the first step in promote self-esteem and confidence of both the parents and young people of the participant families, that this project would be the beginning of developing a process of communication and decisionmaking abilities of the participants, and that this project will develop leadership skills, in prove their confidence, and hopefully experienced a strengthening of relationship with their parents.

We feel that the project was of real benefit to both the participants and their families in terms of strengthening the family bonds through understanding of exciting issues; and this will have a knock on affect within their community.

The idea of this programme was generated by members of the "Pearses Finest Fifteen" youth club when a number of young people explained to Youth Workers that they didn't feel that they could speak to their parents, as their relationship was poor. Youth Workers tried to encourage them to discuss issues that affect their lives with their parents however they refused. They stated that they would feel comfortable talking to other adults but not their own parents. The aim of this programme will be to build relationship between parents and the young people through participation in debates, fun activities and intergenerational comparisons. The programme gives both parents and young people the opportunity to discuss issues affecting their lives and hopefully a greater understanding of each other's point of view.
